Job Overview	To undertake technical duties within the Visual Arts & Design department, in accordance with the department's development plan and the school's mission statement.

Key Responsibilities

- To be fully competent with the Adobe Creative Suite especially Illustrator and Photoshop is essential.
- To have knowledge of specialist screen printing equipment and processes - have the ability to coat screens and expose them.
- To check materials supplies, research suitable equipment to purchase, order and receive stock.
- To maintain the stock cupboard and other resource systems in an orderly manner.
- To restock classrooms with materials.
- To prepare materials and equipment for specific lessons and clear away.
- To make frames, cutting boards etc for painting, mixed media
- To undertake some specialist cleaning of rooms- especially the print room.
- To fully assist in exhibitions of artwork and art events, assembling boards etc.
- To provide induction and ongoing support as required, for all technical equipment for both staff and students.
- To provide technical support in lessons as required, e.g. 3D design, printmaking, photography and textiles.
- To be responsible for managing visual arts and design (including digital) equipment loans, preparing equipment, providing maintenance where possible or organising repairs etc.
- To liaise with the department digital technologies manager and ICT support over computer issues.
- To support students and staff in digital arts work outside of lessons, e.g. file conversions, rendering, work ready for exhibiting
- To attend departmental meetings, take minutes, and undertake INSET as required.
- To support and promote the school and department code of practice regarding discipline, professional conduct and equality of opportunity.

The BRIT School is the UK's first and leading free performing and creative arts school for 1,450 young people aged 14 to 19. The School – an exempt charity based in Croydon – provides a unique education for over 1,450 pupils aged between 14 and 19 in the fields of music, film, digital design, community arts, visual arts and design, production and performing arts as well as a full academic programme of GCSEs and A Levels.

It invests in the future of the UK's cultural wealth by nurturing young artistic talent from all backgrounds and teaching the skills needed by the rapidly growing creative industries.

BRIT stands for the British Record Industry Trust and funding from the BRIT Awards and BRIT Trust is invested in the professional facilities and equipment at the School.

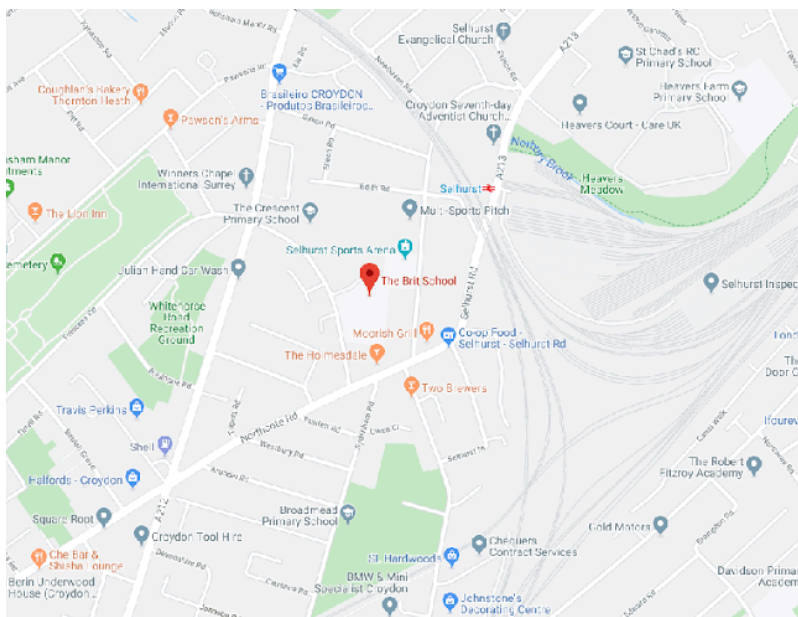
